NYSATA Members,

We are reaching out to clarify and provide support in understanding the licensure requirements as sent out by the New York State Education Department on 10/7/25. We know that this information can seem overwhelming, but we are here to provide you with some resources to assist you in the licensing process.

LICENSING TRANSITION

If you are currently registered, please continue to renew your registration with NYSED as you normally would and you will be automatically transitioned into licensure on December 22, 2025. This is all you must do to maintain your credential through NYS at this time.

MANDATING TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

Registration renewals after December 22, 2025, require proof of completion of Mandated Training Related to Child Abuse and Mandated Training in Infection Control

Here is a link to a [FREE mandated reporter training](#). It is a 2-hour online course and requires you to click through it (you should be able to save your spot and come back, but please confirm this when you begin the course)

Here is a link to the [Infection Control Training](#). This course is \$25 and is good for four years. Please check with your employer first to see if you've already completed this requirement as a clinical provider.

When you renew your license, you will check a box that says you have completed these requirements. Please save your certificates in the event of an audit (as you do for your BOC CEUs).

WRITTEN PROTOCOLS

We will be providing links to sample standard written protocols on the [NYSATA Governmental Affairs Website](#) in the upcoming weeks.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

As part of your regular continuing education to maintain your BOC credentials, you will also be required to do 45 hours every 3 years with a NYSED approved provider. We have received verbal confirmation that NATA and EATA are becoming NYSED approved providers so your CEUs may overlap between the BOC and NYSED. NYSATA conference as well as various other agencies in NY will become NYSED approved providers and we will send out links to these courses as they become available.

As only 15 of the 45 hours can be done as self-study, please plan to attend live presentations from these NYSED approved agencies for 10 CEUs per year for a total of 30 CEUs in the 3-year period. Live presentations can be in-person events, live virtual events, or a recorded virtual event that has a LIVE Q&A at the end.

You are not required to start recording these NYSED approved CEUs until December of 2028. NYSED approved providers will become available as we get closer to the requirement for recording these credits in 2028. If your intent is to have the CEUs overlap, please confirm that the provider is both BOC and NYSED approved. Please continue your BOC CEU requirements and we will send out more information about the NYSED approved providers as they become available.
